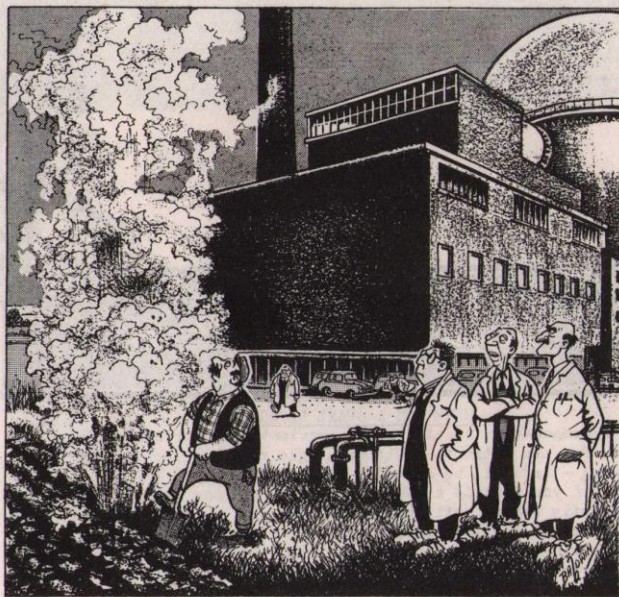

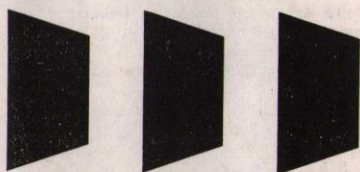

**Optical illusions in type forms**



Shapes of the same size seem to differ in size when placed side by side. The second shape seems larger than the first, the third larger than the second.



Optical illusions in type forms are caused partly by distortions produced by the physical constitution of the human eye, and partly by the interaction of colours, shapes etc. of the forms themselves. The type designer is therefore more concerned with the subjective and visual, rather than the objective and mathematical, in designing type forms.
